Old Testament Reading: *Verses from Psalm 19*

The heavens are telling of the glory of God
and the firmament proclaims his handiwork.

Day to day pours forth speech

and night to night declares knowledge.
There are neither words nor language
nor sound of any voices.
Yet their utterance goes out to the whole earth
and their words to the ends of the world.

In the heavens he has set a tent for the sun
who comes forth as a bridegroom from his canopy.

and makes its circuit to the other extremity,
and nothing is hidden from its heat.

New Testament Reading: *Romans 8: 18 - 23 (NRSV)*

I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labour pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies.

Gospel Reading *Matthew 6: 25 - 33 (NIV)*

Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? And who of you by worrying can add a single hour to your life?

And why do you worry about clothes? See how the lilies of the field grow; they do not labour or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendour was dressed like one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.
